COMPOST

is an organic material that can be used as a soil amendment or as a medium to grow plants. Mature compost is a stable material with a content called humus that is dark brown or black and has a soil-like, earthy smell. Our compost is created by combining organic wastes (e.g., yard trimmings and ground leaves) in proper ratios into piles or rows; adding bulking agents as necessary to accelerate the breakdown of organic materials and allowing the finished material to fully stabilize and mature through a curing process. After the compost is cured and screened it is available to residents participating in the Authority.

WOOD MULCHING

consists of applying a mixture of shredded wood mulch, bark or compost to disturbed soils. The primary function of wood mulching is to reduce erosion by protecting bare soil from rainfall impact, increasing infiltration, and reducing runoff. Wood mulch is suitable for disturbed soil areas requiring temporary protection until permanent stabilization is established. Mulch is used as a topping to make areas of any type of bed look finished and to reduce the growth of weeds.

How It Works

Participating Township/Borough residents are to drop off their yard waste material at their municipality's designated **Drop Off Site** or at the **Central Processing Site**. The Authority, Townships or Boroughs will transport the material to the Central Processing Center located at 6701 Weaversville Road where it will be processed into mulch and compost.

The residents from the Townships/Boroughs will be allowed to drop off yard waste at the Processing Center (with proper identification or permit) or at the municipalities drop off sites. After processed, the finished product is transported to the municipalities for pick up by the residents or the residents can pick up compost or mulch at the Processing Center.

Proof of residency and/or permits are required at all municipal and Processing Center Drop Off Sites.



Township/Borough Drop Off Sites Accept

Leaves

- Loose or in brown paper bio-degradable bags only.

Brush

Natural and Untreated Wood

- 4 to 12 inches diameter
- Christmas trees free of ornaments, tinsel and plastic bags.

Yard Waste

- Hedge trimmings
- Garden/flower plant residue

Central Processing Site Accepts All of the Above Including:

- Stumps and bigger pieces of wood need approval prior to dropping off (minimal charge might apply)
- Grass clippings (certain rules apply)

Not Accepted At Any Site

- Sod • Dirt • Plastic Bags

your grass by using a mulching mower or by cutting your lawn frequently and leaving the grass on the lawn. Leaving the mower height higher allows less grass to mulch and allows less to thatch. Mulching provides an excellent lawn fertilizer.
